
Dr. Jekabs Bikis Dean of Online Education

Dr. Jim Underwood, DBU professor of management, has recently produced two new books covering issues of management, ethics, and relational interaction.



Co-written with Dr. Les Carter, *The Significance Breakthrough* ties into their previous work, *The Significance Principle*, and describes how the innate human desire to seek significance can be used for good when applied with humility and grace to serve others.

Dr. Underwood has been a member of the DBU faculty in the College of Business for 22 years.



Dr. Bob Colton Advisor of the Year

The 2011 Advisor of the Year is Dr. Bob Colton. Dr. Colton is a professor of psychology and counseling in the DBU College of Humanities and Social Sciences. He has served as a full-time faculty member since 1990 and was the director of the DBU Counseling Center for 20 years as a licensed psychologist in the State of Texas. He also served part time as a counselor for many years at the Irving Christian Counseling Center.

Prior to coming to DBU, Dr. Colton was a pastor in churches in both Colorado and Texas for over 20 years. He and his wife, Mary Jane, have two children and nine grandchildren.

Each year, students are provided the opportunity to nominate their advisors for this award, and a committee reviews the nominations and selects the winners.
