

Abbreviations and Codes

Course Numbering

The **first digit** of the numerical course code reflects the level of the course.

UNDERGRADUATE

Freshman	<u>1</u> 000
Sophomore.....	<u>2</u> 000
Junior.....	<u>3</u> 000
Senior.....	<u>4</u> 000

GRADUATE

Master's	<u>5</u> 000- <u>6</u> 000
Doctoral	<u>7</u> 000- <u>8</u> 000

The **second digit** indicates the number of credit hours awarded for the course (1, 2, 3, or 4 credit hours).

<u>1</u> 101	1 credit hour	<u>1</u> 406	4 credit hours
<u>4</u> 218	2 credit hours	<u>7</u> 389	3 credit hours

The **third and fourth** digits are specific to the individual course. For instance, many courses with 00 or 01 for the third and fourth digits are **foundations, principles, or survey** courses.

When the third character of the course number is the **letter L**, such as GEOL 14L1, the class is a **lab** rather than a lecture.

When the letters **HR** follow the four digit course number, the course is being offered to students in the Honors Program:

HNRS 1001HR = Freshman **Honors** Enrichment.

Examples of complete course codes:

POLS 2301 = Political Science • **sophomore level** • **three credit hours** • **American National Government**

COUN 6317 = Professional Counseling • **master's level** • **three credit hours** • **Counseling Practicum**

Section Codes

A period or a space following the four digits of the numerical course code introduces the section code. Each time a course is offered, it is given a section number specific to that particular class, differentiating it from the same course being offered in other time slots and at other locations.

The section code is comprised of four characters. The first two reflect the **term** (EW, NW, LW, SP, SB, SI, M1, M2, M3, SI, LS, L1, L2, L3, L4, A1, A2, A3, FA, FB, FI). The last two characters reflect the **section** of a course (a particular class offered at a specific place and time or online) such as 01, 02, H1, N1. Examples of four character section codes: A201, LSH1, FAN1.

Hybrid courses use an H plus a number. Examples:

- POLS 2301.**LSH1** Long Summer term ▪ **hybrid class** (first hybrid section listed for POLS 2301)
- POLS 2301.**SPH2** Spring term ▪ **hybrid class** (second hybrid section listed for POLS 2301)

Online courses use an N plus a number. Examples:

- SPED 5320.**FAN1** Fall term ▪ **online class** (first online section listed for SPED 5320)
- SPED 5320.**SPN2** Spring term ▪ **online class** (second online section listed for SPED 5320)

A complete course and section code will look something like this:

- Weekend sections in time slot order
- Sections with To Be Determined time, day, and location are shown last.

Site Codes

Courses with the site designation of **Campus** are offered on the DBU main campus located on Mountain Creek Parkway. The student's printed registration receipt may show **MC** meaning Main Campus.

Site codes for other DBU campuses are **DBUN** (DBU North campus) and **DBCSL** (DBU Center for Servant Leadership).

DBU also offers many online classes that designate **Internet** for the site. These course offerings will not include day or time information.

Some DBU classes are held at various sites around the Metroplex. Some of these are military science classes offered at other universities (MILS offered at both UTA and the DBU main campus and AEST classes offered at TCU).

Other classes are offered at local schools and are open only to students in educational cohorts. Examples of these include SHL (Shelton School), CFNI (Christ for the Nations), LSRO (Life School of Red Oak) and others.

Courses that include traveling to other states or countries will show TRVL for the site.

Courses with the CP designation are offered in the Continuous Progress mode.
