



THE EBBY HALLIDAY CENTER

A special birthday celebration held this past spring marked the official opening of DBU's new Ebby Halliday Center. Many gathered to wish the birthday girl, Ebby Halliday Acers, a happy 93rd birthday, as they also toured the new facility named in honor of this extraordinary servant leader.

The new Ebby Halliday Center, equipped with a swimming pool, arbor, conference rooms, faculty offices, large living room, and a fully functional kitchen, provides a "home away from home" for over 250 students who live in the Colonial Village Apartments.

Ebby Halliday Acers began her career selling hats in Kansas City during the Great Depression and eventually moved to Dallas, where in 1945 she began selling homes in the post-war boom. Over the last 55 years, Ebby Halliday Realtors has grown to become one of the largest independently owned residential real estate companies in the world.

Through the years, Ebby has given generously of her time and money to benefit numerous organizations. Because of her leadership and generosity, in 1990 DBU selected Ebby, along with her husband Maurice Acers, as the recipients of the Russell H. Perry Free Enterprise Award. In addition, the University awarded Ebby with an

honorary Doctor of Humanities degree in 1995.

"Having been blessed during my life," explained Ebby, "I have long believed in giving back to the community. I am proud to be associated with Dallas Baptist University and honored that DBU's new community center will be named after me. Healthy communities develop moral fiber which is essential in raising up leaders, and the Ebby Halliday Center will be a place for students to join together and build that solid foundation."
