Birth and Early Childhood

The doctor exclaimed to the parents, "It's a Girl!" On May 1, 1975 they named the baby girl, Shannon Kaye Forsythe...that's me. It was a day they would never forget. Randy and Beth Forsythe were so excited, because it was their first child. Yet they were scared at the same time. Mom got pregnant her senior year in high school at the age of 18. Dad was only a couple of years older. They thought they loved each other and decided the right thing to do was to get married before the baby was born. Dad also decided to join the Air Force in order to make something of his life, while Mom would stay home and take care of me.

One year, two months, and eight days later, my sister Melissa was born. Melissa was born premature and very unhealthy. They did not know if Melissa would survive. I found out a couple of years ago, the reason Melissa was born prematurely was because my Dad (from hereon I will refer to as Father) had pushed my Mom down a flight of stairs.

My earliest childhood memory is of my Father throwing his cowboy boot across the room and hitting my Mom in the head with the heel of the boot. Despite all of the abuse, Mom stayed with him. Like my Mom I wasn't angry with him either, because as far as I knew, this was normal. I loved him! He did no wrong in my eyes.

Then on April 2, 1979 my brother Jason was born. Three kids in a four year span had put quite a strain on their marriage, both emotionally and financially; after all, they were still kids themselves. The Air Force restationed my Father from Fort Worth, TX to Great Falls, Montana. After being in Montana a few months my parents decided they couldn't handle things anymore and they needed help. My sister and I were sent back to Texas, while my Mom, Father and new baby brother stayed in Montana. I would live with my Grandma and Granddad. Melissa would live with Aunt Kathy and Uncle Marshall. I blamed my Mom and thought she didn't want me anymore. I am writing this and thinking, "Man, I really had an awful childhood". But, then I realize God had a plan all along. This became a huge turning point in my life spiritually.

My Grandma, with whom I now lived, was my Angel on Earth. She taught me about God and Jesus. She read the Bible to me daily. She took me to Church. She gave me Bible versus' to memorize, and if I learned them she would take me to McDonald's or Kentucky Fried Chicken to get whatever I wanted. She encouraged me, praised me, adored me, and most importantly, she loved me! I knew I was loved, and that felt good!

When I turned five, my Mom and little brother moved back to Texas. They moved in with my Grandma and Melissa came too. My Mom had finally had enough and decided to divorce my Father. By the time I started Kindergarten the divorce was final. My Father said he would come to see us. Melissa and I would fall asleep on the couch waiting for him to come when he said he was, but he never showed up. I took

this anger out on my Mom, because in my mind it was her fault that they got a divorce in the first place.

Kindergarten was fine, I guess. Grandma's house was directly across the street from my school, Mark Twain Elementary. Even though we lived right across the street, I was late to school every single day. I had to go to the office everyday to get a tardy slip. I remember the ladies in the office asking me why I was late everyday, if I lived right across the street. I just shrugged my shoulders. When I became an adult I asked my Mom this very question and she told me she had gone back to College and was gone before we left for school and my Grandma thought school started at a later time. I still remember the feeling of not fitting in very well with the other kids...I felt out of place.

When I was in first grade, something awful happened. My Mom started dating this man named Bill. The first time he came over to meet Melissa, Jason, and I, I opened the door, stuck my tongue out at him and closed the door in his face. He was trying to take my Father's place. He took us to the movies, Six Flags, swimming, out to eat. He yelled at me for scratching Melissa's arms up and spanked Jason for peeing in his pants. Who did he think he was! I did not like him at all! But Mom liked him and forced us to be around him all the time on the weekends.

The summer after second grade, my Mom got remarried to Bill. We had to move out of Grandma's house and live with him now. He was so mean. I hated him. All he did was make us say "yes sir" and "no sir", we had to help clean the dishes, he yelled at me for hitting Melissa. He had no right to come into my life and tell me what to do.

Then I started third grade at a new school, where I knew no one. After the first six weeks, I got grounded for making bad grades on my report card. Grounded? What's that? I soon found out what "grounded" meant when I couldn't go outside and ride my bike. The next six weeks when I got bad grades, I hid my report cards and told my Mom and Step-Dad (from hereon I will refer to as Dad) that the teacher didn't give me one. My mom arranged a conference with the teacher and found out that the teacher really had given out report cards...and that I had lied! I remember getting a spanking twice in my life, this was on of those times. My Dad sat down with me and broke down my walls brick by brick. After that conversation, I didn't hate him so much anymore. The next day of school, I started my education. I wanted to prove to myself and my Dad that I wasn't stupid. The next six weeks I couldn't wait to bring home my report card, because I was proud. I made all A's and B's!

My fourth grade year I had a teacher that really cared. Mrs. Bounds sent home special notes saying how proud she was of me and what a great job I had done. She really boosted my self-esteem. In fact, my parents still have those notes in a special metal lock box in their closet. I made friends and felt like I fit in for the first time.

We moved from Duncanville to Cedar Hill in the middle of my sixth grade year. I was upset, because I would have to make new friends all over again. I was scared. I did fine though. In the seventh grade I campaigned to be in the Student Council. I

made posters, stickers, fliers, all kinds of stuff to get my name out. The results were read out over the loud speaker...I made it! All my hard work had paid off and I was proud of myself! I couldn't wait to tell my family, so I went to the office and called my Mom, Dad and Grandma and told them I made it!

In seventh grade I made a friend named Jennifer House. She was pretty and nice. She helped me learn how to do my hair and make-up. For the first time I felt pretty. So now I've just made Student Council, I've made my first best friend, I feel pretty, I'm making good grades...I was on top of the world!

In eighth grade I was in Choir. They were having try-outs for Show Choir, which was a group that sang and danced. I really liked to sing, so I tried out. I made it. In Show Choir I made lots of friends. I made one special friend named Amy Newton. I would spend weekends with her. Her family went to church every Sunday, so I went with them since I had spent the night. I got involved in a really active Youth Group and revived my spiritual side. Soon my Mom, Aunts, Grandma's and sister and brother were all going to church with me. I think my Dad even went a couple of times. I went to Church Camp year after year. God was alive in me! I had overcome and survived my childhood.

Young Adult Years

I continued to do well in school. I was involved in many extra-curricular activities. I attended church all day Sunday, Wednesday nights and anything in between. I loved life and my past was behind me. My sophomore year I tried out to be a Junior Varsity Cheerleader and made it. I became very popular at school. My sophomore year I was voted "Most Friendly" in the High School yearbook. I loved Cheering. At the end of the year I was voted "Most Spirited" Cheerleader by our squad. My extroverted personality and good communication skills began to shine as my self-esteem and confidence blossomed.

My junior year, a guy (Josh) that I had liked since I moved to Cedar Hill asked me to be his girlfriend. I said yes without hesitation. After a couple of months of "going together", I asked my Mom if I could go on a group date with Josh. She agreed, but only if Melissa went with us. On the way home, a drunk driver ran a red light and hit our car. I remember everything going in slow motion. The car must have spun around about three times before it stopped. I could hardly breathe my seat belt was so tight. I managed to unfasten my seat belt and when I did Melissa fell out of the car. When she fell on to the pavement, she was unconscious with blood covering her face. In my mind I knew she was dead. I tried to get to her but couldn't. My body was paralyzed. I remember screaming her name over and over again. Finally, Care Flight landed and took Melissa away. I was taken by ambulance to Charlton Methodist Hospital. Josh's Mom was there and called a neighbor of my parents to knock on the door to tell my Mom. As it turns out, Josh had a few scratches, I had a broken foot and Melissa was in a coma for nine days. She had suffered from a Traumatic Brain Injury. When the car

hit our car one of the tee tops hit Melissa in the head. When she finally came to she remembered nothing. She had to relearn how to walk, talk, eat, think, everything.

Instead of feeling guilty and sorry for Melissa, I used the time that my parents were away at the hospital with Melissa as a time to get closer to Josh. I fell in love with him! Not long after that Josh became very possessive of me. He didn't want me to hang out with any of my friends, only him. He cheated on with one of my friends. When I found out he begged for my forgiveness and promised to never do it again. During the end of junior year and throughout my senior year I went from "Most Friendly" to "Most Isolated". I had no friends. Yet I was so committed to him, that when my Dad forbad me to see Josh anymore, I moved out of the house during my senior year. I did manage to stay in school and I graduated June 1993.

After high school, I followed Josh to the University of North Texas. I borrowed money from my Uncle Mike to attend school. I registered for 12 hours. The exact same 12 hours Josh registered for. I got a seasonal job at a Christmas Store in Denton as a Supervisor over five employees. I was in charge of training and supervising employees, opening and closing the store, working the register, inventory, stocking the shelves and depositing the cash at day end. I really enjoyed working. It was a form of therapy for me. I felt important, like I was making a valid contribution to the company. But shortly after Christmas was over I was out of a job.

I had not talked to my parents in over six months, Josh had become physically and mentally abusive to me, I had no friends, no self-esteem, and no relationship with God. Josh had completely isolated me from everyone that I cared about, and I allowed him to do it. Josh decided in February 1994 that he was dropping out of school and enrolling in the Navy. I dropped out of school as well, because if Josh wasn't there, there was no reason for me to be there. On top of that, my Grandma had a stroke and died in April. The two people I had loved most in the world were gone.

Career Years

I moved from Denton to Richardson to live with my Aunt Susie and Uncle Larry. While I was there I got in contact with some old high school friends. One of my friends told me about a job opening at the company she worked for. The position would be as a receptionist for the Communication Towers in Cedar Hill. I jumped at the opportunity. I really liked the owners of Doty-Moore Tower Services. My responsibilities were to answer the phones, prepare and send out correspondents to potential customers, attend and take the minutes and notes at the weekly safety meetings, and handle incoming and outgoing mail. After time, I took on the responsibility of payroll and direct deposit into the employee bank accounts.

Work helped me keep my mind off of Josh. I'll never forget the day I called my Dad from work. As soon as I said, "Dad", he said, "It's so good to hear your voice. Why don't you come over for dinner tonight". My parents made it very easy for me to repair the damage I had caused.

I worked hard and managed to get my own car and rent an apartment in Arlington. After about a year and a half of employment, I was laid off because the company was down-sizing. I didn't let this get me down. I hit the classified ads right away. Within a week I had a job as a Customer Service Representative for a Water Bottling Company in Grand Prairie, Texas Premium Waters. Any complaints customers had I would try to solve. This is where I discovered how much I enjoyed working with customers. It was fulfilling to me to turn an irate customer into a satisfied and content customer. After two months, I was promoted to the General Managers Administrative Assistant. I still worked with customers, but I also took care of Payroll, Accounts Payable and Accounts Receivable.

While working here I made a lot of friends and regained my self-esteem and confidence. My sister, Melissa, was working down the street at Cheddars and wanted me to have dinner with her one night. While we were eating she tells me that there is a guy named Chris that she works with, that she really wants me to meet. I told her that I had no interest in meeting anyone. I was done with guys and was becoming a nun! Before I could stop her she had waved "the guy" over and was introducing us. Whenever I saw him, I got butterflies. His smile made me melt. After he got off work, we met for dinner. We really hit it off. He was kind, interesting, good-looking, graduating from college in two months, etc. Basically he was too good to be true!

From that day on, we were together. Chris graduated in December 1995 with a BBA in Marketing at UTA. I was so proud of him. Even though I thought he was wonderful, I was very cautious with my feelings, as I did not want to get hurt again. I quit my job at the Water Bottling Company, so I could go back to school. I got a job waiting tables at Trail Dust Steakhouse, so my work schedule would flexible with my school schedule. Chris was very supportive of my endeavors. We were open and honest with each other about our pasts. No matter how awful my past seemed to me, it didn't seem to phase Chris in the least. The more time we spent together, the more we learned that we shared the same values and views. Six months into our relationship Chris asked me to marry him. I reluctantly agreed, because I wanted to finish school before I got married. Chris assured me that marriage would not get in the way of my school. I was also reluctant, because of the effect my parents divorce had on me. He understood because he had come from a family of divorce as well. We both agreed that marriage is forever and took the concept for seriously.

Even though I wanted to throw up a wall, I decided against it and followed my heart. We were engaged thirteen months before we got married on May 17, 1997. We got pregnant on the honeymoon. Our son, Brandon Louis Consalus, was born on February 7, 1998. I could not handle the restaurant hours anymore, since I had a baby, so I applied for a receptionist position at Automated Food Systems, Inc. in Duncanville, Texas. I was hired in July of 1998. One week after I started working for Automated Food Systems, Inc., I found out I was pregnant again. Our daughter, Kaylee Rose Consalus, was born on February 17, 1999.

As the receptionist, my main responsibilities were answering incoming phone calls, taking customer orders and making the shipping arrangements. In December of 1999, I was promoted to Bookkeeper and Assistant Office Manager. My primary job responsibilities were Accounts Receivable, Accounts Payable, Payroll, Collections, Prepare and Print Financial Statements for month end Financial Meeting, Prepare and Print Budget Report, International Shipping and Receiving Agent, Reconciliation of Bank accounts, Wire Transfer of Funds and Supervise daily flow of office. In January 2000, I was promoted to Office Manager/Human Resource Manager. I maintained my bookkeeping and assistant office manager responsibilities, plus I became responsible for handling the tasks associated with maintaining the company health, workers compensation, liability and auto insurance. I was also assigned the tasks of preparing, scheduling and performing the various aspects of employee reviews, interviews, orientations and evaluations.

Automated Food Systems, Inc. is a small company made up of twelve employees. I have gained a lot of experience, because I have been given the opportunity to wear many hats within the company. This is beneficial because it allows me to observe first hand how the many different functions of a company fit together to achieve success. I like my job, because I feel like what I do makes a difference within the company. I am a valuable asset to the company, and that is motivation to me.

The Present

Brandon and Kaylee are our lives. We love them so much and we make sure they know that. While I would like to have stayed home with the kids, it just wasn't an option for us financially. We researched daycares thoroughly and we felt blessed to have found a Christian Daycare that exceeded our expectations.

I have taken classes periodically since Chris and I got married, but I wanted my focus and attention to be on the kids. Brandon started Kindergarten this year, so I decided I would go back to school too. I am excited about attending Dallas Baptist University. I feel like God has lead me here and I'm right were I'm supposed to be.

Writing this Autobiography was very hard for me, because it made me uncover a lot of old skeletons that I did not necessarily want to dig up. There were things I could have and maybe should have left out, but I felt like in order for this self-examination to be truly effective I needed to be truly open and honest.

I know in my heart that God has a plan for each of us. The life that I have had was God's plan for me. My childhood taught me what kind of parent I wanted to be and what kind of parent I did not want to me. It taught me that I wanted to marry for keeps. I did not want to divorce and put my kids through the difficulties I had to go through coming from a broken home. It taught me the kind of mother that I wanted to be and have become.
